2. What clinical s/s would you look for to determine if he is experiencing anaphylactic shock?
3. What nursing interventions and medical treatments would you anticipate?

Scenario 2

An elderly woman is admitted to the medical floor for an UTI. You notice that she has become steadily more tachycardic and her urine output has dropped to 50 mL over the last 8 hours.

1. How would you assess this patient for the possibility of sepsis?
2. What stage of shock would this be called?

Scenario 3

While working in the emergency department, a victim of a motor vehicle crash comes in by ambulance. His pelvis appears deformed, he is pale, diaphoretic, and his heart rate is 124.

1. What type of shock is this patient most likely in?
2. What led you to that conclusion?
3. Name some interventions and prioritize them.

Scenario 4

You are taking care of a spinal cord-injured patient in the ICU. His BP has not been responsive to repeated fluid boluses.

1. What type of shock is he mostly likely experiencing?
2. Name some appropriate interventions and prioritize them.

developed of a three phase framework for VAD and tested its preliminary effects on nursing students debriefing experiences reflective abilities and nursing competencies using a pretest posttest design Study III adopted a qualitative method to explore nursing students experiences and perspectives of a structured VAD using focus groups Data were analyzed using thematic analysis approach Study IV employed a mixed method research design to investigate the impact of a three phase VAD on nursing students debriefing experiences perceived stress as well as facilitators perceptions and debriefing practices Results Study I showed that existing VAD offered comparable educational effects as VD in terms of learners experiences attitudes and performance except on knowledge acquisition Video did not demonstrate its continuous advantage in debriefing which informed the absence of best practice The preliminary results of Study II reported that a three phase VAD significantly improved students debriefing experiences p
