Chapter 5: Concentrates for Hemostatic Disorders and Hereditary Angioedema

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BACKGROUND

Coagulation factor concentrates are highly effective treatments for patients with hemostatic disorders caused by missing or defective clotting factors. Coagulation factor concentrates may be extracted from pooled donated plasma-(plasma-derived) or manufactured using biotechnology (recombinant). In addition, several plasmaderived protein concentrates are available for the treatment of thrombotic disorders and hereditary angioedema.

These factor concentrates available to Canadian patients, as either licensed or unlicensed products, are listed in Table 1. The unlicensed products, and some licensed products that have not undergone Health Canada batch release, can be obtained under the Health Canada Special Access Program (SAP) (see legend in Table 1).
