The developmental editor analyzes the broad elements of your manuscript in order to improve the quality of your content.



Line editing

The line editor takes a close look at the tone and emotion in your writing, refining your unique style and voice.



Copy editing

The copy editor removes mechanical errors and inconsistencies, improving the clarity and readability of your writing.



Proofreading

The proofreader undertakes a stringent quality check to remove all hindrances to readability, from typos to formatting mistakes.
