- Laboratory: benefit; able to control variables, drawback: experiments are performed in artificial settings that may not completely reflect a real setting;
  Field: benefit: more accurately reflects real conditions, drawback: harder to control all variables
- scientists might want to use a model when their experiment is not practical to perform in real-time, such as when attempting to forecast how conditions might change in the future; models are also used to predict how changing one or more variables may affect future conditions
