The new educational policies will shift the focus of writing instruction onto argument writing as part of students' college readiness. In a survey and analysis of the argument scholarship in the National Council of Teachers of English's NCTE premier journals on the teaching of writing, *College English* and *College Composition and Communication*, I demonstrate the clear trend in college argument scholarship away from initially hostile two-sided debates.
