 - Atoms
 - All matter, smallest unit of an element that has the chemical properties of the element.
 - Molecules/ macromolecules
 - Made up of two or more atoms bonded together.
 - Many molecules bonded together to form a polymer such as polypeptide are macromolecules-> carbohydrates, proteins, and nucleic acids.(DNA & RNA)
 - Cells
 - Molecules surrounded by membrane
 - Smallest/simplest unit of life
 - Unicellular (bacteria)
 - Multicellular (plants & animals)
 - Tissue
 - Many cells of Same type
 - Ex- muscle tissue
 - Organs
 - Two types of tissue working together
 - Ex- heart
 - Organisms
 - All living things
 - Each belongs to a species
 - Species
 - Related group of organisms that share a distinct form and set of attributes in nature
 - The members of the same species are closely related genetically.
 - Population
 - Organisms of the same species occupy the same environment.
 - Community
 - An assemblage of populations of different species
 - The type found in a community are determined by the environment and by the interactions of a species with each other.
 - Ecosystem
 - Formed by interactions of a community of organisms with their physical environment
